- YOUR FESTIVAL ONLINE

RESOURCES to stimulate classroom music making will be created by the outstanding sound artist and composer DUNCAN CHAPMAN. Aimed at informing and exciting pupils in the run up to the live festival experience, these resources will be available for teachers and staff to download and explore from August 2010 and will support key objectives of the Curriculum for Excellence.

LOVE MUSIC RADIO allows all festival-goers to hear and tag new music from all of our festival artists before they touchdown in Scotland.

MAPMUSIC, a project specially commissioned from French–American sound artist Yann Seznec, will allow pupils to create their own digital mixes and soundscapes online. This will be available to small groups of pupils with specialist interest in learning about digital music making.

- YOUR FESTIVAL AT YOUR SCHOOL

There will also be the possibility of receiving in-school workshops in the run-up to the festival. Composer and sound artist DUNCAN CHAPMAN will offer in-school workshops and online events exploring how simple music and sound technologies can be used creatively in the classroom. The project will include a CPD session for teachers, an online GLOW workshop for pupils and a full day workshop in school suitable for classes or mixed year groups of students in S3-S6 studying music.

Duncan will provide schools with free looping software and will also introduce the concept of "visual spectrums of music", which displays how the physical properties of individual sounds can be broken down into many small sound fragments. Teachers and pupils will be able to use these free software programmes to create their own compositions.
